- Work Experience
 - ► Try to get a variety GP, hospital, district nurses etc
 - Keep a reflective diary/logbook each day you do, will help you a lot further down the line
- Personal Statement
 - ► ~500 words about you
 - ▶ Be as reflective as possible



How do I get in? (4)



- ► More exams ⊗
- Scottish universities all use the UCAT
 - ► Multiple choice
 - ▶ 5 sections, very time pressured
- ► Some universities in the Rest of UK use BMAT
- Make sure you prepare

How do I get in? (5)

- Interviews
- ► Tips:
 - Know your personal statement well
 - Practice the classic questions don't make them scripted though
 - Dress smartly
 - ► Have a good knowledge of current health-related news
 - ► Smile!

Now I'm in - where should I go?

- Course structures vary
 - ► First few years focus more on science lectures, PBL, essays etc.
 - Progressively more clinical as years go by
- Intercalation compulsory vs. optional
- ► Make sure you like the city, go to the open days
- ► Lots of travelling to different places
