This has been something of a landmark month for Dollar sport. In 2015, Scottish Hockey began running an S3 National Cup competition alongside the U18 event and in 2017 Dollar won the S3 Cup for the third year in succession. This season's S3 team beat The Mary Erskine School 2-1 in the final, ensuring that Dollar remain the *only* team to have won this event. This outstanding achievement reflects the tremendous work put in by our hockey coaches and players under the leadership of Ms Allan. There can be no question that the school runs one of the best hockey programmes in Scotland.

The same could be said of our rugby. Over 60 teams take part each year in the Rosslyn Park Sevens Cup competition, with another 100 or so in the lower tier Vase. Despite all four of our U18 internationalists having to miss the event, our senior Sevens team had an impressive run in the Cup competition last Thursday, beating some excellent English teams before losing narrowly to eventual semi-finalists Bedford. The school was also proud that Euan McLaren captained Scotland U18 against England U18 on the same day that FP John Barclay captained the senior Scottish team against England at Murrayfield.

Not to be outdone, our footballers reached the semi-final of the SISFA Cup and our gymnasts, swimmers and athletes have all recently achieved significant success in national competitions. Additionally, as if to prove that sport is for everyone, Dollar's annual cross-country event attracted the largest field of runners in recent memory.

Of course, sport is only one facet of life at Dollar, as those who attended the two excellent Spring Concerts last week will know. Shortly before the concerts, four Dollar ensembles were entered for the huge Perform at Perth festival and all four won their classes. As it happens, I remember performing at this event myself many years ago, singing *Charlie is my Darling* with the Dunblane Primary School choir. I do not remember winning any prizes, but I did at least marginally extend my understanding of Jacobite history. With that in mind, I should congratulate our General Knowledge team who won the national Schools Quiz final a few weeks ago.

Despite all these wonderful co-curricular achievements, it has not been hard to remember that the core business of the school is learning and teaching. Over the last few weeks, every quiet space in the school seems to have been occupied by a senior pupil poring over an assignment, dissertation or piece of coursework. As with most areas of school life, hard work can bring substantial reward.
