Rector's DOLLAR ACADEMY

Dear Pupils, Parents, Guardians and Friends

It is not uncommon for schools to say they are trying to produce children who are confident, but not arrogant, and this certainly applies to Dollar. My belief is that most parents who chose Dollar feel the same way. Between us we seem to do a pretty good job and I am very proud of the likeable young people we turn out. Our Form VI pupils are responsible for conducting school tours and the comments I receive afterwards about the wonderful job they do in this respect are really quite inspiring. I also frequently receive praise from members of the public who have met our youngsters on schools trips and a few years ago I received a letter out of the blue from a letting agent in a university city in Scotland who told me that he generally offers his best student properties to Dollar pupils because they are usually so reliable and respectful!

The writer Habeeb Akande has neatly described arrogance as thinking others are below you, whereas confidence is knowing no-one is above you. I was reminded of that when listening to our pupils asking questions following an excellent address by Sir Paul Grice, the Chief Executive of the Scottish Parliament, when he visited Dollar to talk to our Politics and International Relations Society. The questions were challenging and our pupils were not afraid to express a (wellconsidered) opinion. Just as importantly, they were not dogmatic either and were prepared to revise their opinions having listened to other views. And when Dr McConaghy from the St Andrew's University International Relations department visited in October to talk about responses to terrorism, he suggested afterwards that our pupils asked better questions than many of his undergraduate students. In the light of an uncertain political future, it was encouraging to see Dollar pupils demonstrating political engagement and intellectual curiosity. I will not pretend that every question was equally brilliant, but I thought every questioner showed the right mix of confidence and respect. I have commented on this in assembly and have linked this to what I consider to be our essential values: "work hard, be kind, and get involved". These are straightforward and easily understood, but no less powerful for that.
